### Problem

When a file uses the last (96th) directory entry, it is possible in some cases to be able to see the file listed in the directory, but any attempt to access the file by name will result in an invalid ERROR 24: 'File Not Found'. In addition, some new disk file names being created for the first time will give an ERROR 39 from DOS (IE ERROR in BASIC). This problem has existed since TRSDOS 1.1.1.

### Solution

The following patches are for TRSDOS 2.0 and 2.0a only and will correct the symptoms described above. Both must be applied.

PATCH SYSRES/SYS A=1682 F=5F C=60

PATCH SYSRES/SYS A=1699 F=03 C=00

If the first PATCH gives you a "String Not Found" ERROR, ignore it. The PATCH is for people who may have applied a previous PATCH to this location. Location 1682H must contain a 60H. The second PATCH must be applied to eliminate the problems.
